1.	Could you, please, clarify following statement in the Instruction to bidders. Pt. 16 demands a bid security and in 16.2. there is a reference to Section II, Bidding Data Sheet, whrere the amount should be specified. I couldn't find this document and no specification of such a bid security anywhere.	This tender does not require a Bid Security			
2.	According to our knowledge, deliveries and other services to international organizations are taxable in Austria and the invoices therefore include VAT. OSCE has an opportunity to submit application for a refund of the sales tax at the Austrian Federal Ministry of Finance. Is our understanding correct that Austrian suppliers shall invoice their services with VAT?	The OSCE with its Secretariat located in Vienna, Austria is an International Organization which enjoys tax-exempt status, the OSCE does not have a VAT number. Yes, your company might submit an Invoice showing the VAT amount which will be paid by the OSCE and then reimbursed from the Ministry of Finance. However, in the Annex F – Price Schedule, all Bidders are requested to provide its pricing information without the VAT (i.e., NET amount only). Invoicing procedure, the OSCE Letter on Tax Exemption, etc. will be discussed with the successful Bidder at the stage of Contract negotiation/drafting.			
3.	We haven't found any Performance Security Amount specification within the Bid Invitation, and therefore cannot properly include such within our project cost- and risk-assessments. As we have not received any request from OSCE to actually provide such Performance Security, we assume, that it is not required by OSCE from [company's name removed] in this business transaction. As the Bid Invitation predominantly asks for standardized, general available Qualys Software Service Subscription (License & Cloud Service entitlements), we kindly suggest to exclude penalties from these	We do not forces to include penalties in the body of the planned Contract; however, we would propose a standard text which would protect the OSCE from the Contractor's underperformance.
